This month we introduce you to David Keyser:




My name is David Keyser. I was born in Elkhart, IN and lived there until after graduating from high school. My parents are Randy and Pam Keyser. I have six younger siblings: Mitchel 20, Katie 16, Andrea 13, Rachel 10, John 7, and Joseph 4. I attended college in Michigan at Kettering University in Flint. There I studied Mechanical Engineering. While in college, I had an engineering internship for four years at Autoliv in Auburn Hills. When I was on work term, I lived in Lake Orion and attended St. Joseph Parish.

I began considering the priesthood at the end of my junior year in college. Shortly before this, I joined a Catholic young adult group in the area. They have a weekly holy hour and then socialize afterwards. At school, I started going to daily Mass when I was able. In Lake Orion, I started going to the adoration chapel. After much prayer and spiritual direction, I decided to enter the seminary and study for the priesthood. Currently, I am in my third year at the seminary. 

Who We Are

On Oct. 2, 1881, a small group of men met in the basement of St. Mary's Church on Hillhouse Avenue in New Haven, Connecticut. They were called together by their 29-year-old parish priest, Father Michael J. McGivney. These men formed a fraternal society that has become the world's largest Catholic family fraternal service organization. One of the ideals of Fr. McGivney was to provide financial assistance to the widows and orphans of its members. This original idea grew into an organization of Catholic men dedicated to promoting the concepts of charity, unity, fraternity and Patriotism. Today faith, family, and fraternity is the foundation upon which the Knights of Columbus stands. From that first group of Catholic men we have grown to nearly 1.6 million members in 11,000 councils, in the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico Puerto Rico, Guatemala, Panama, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Guam, the Virgin Islands, the Bahamas, and Saipan.
